



COVID-19 Vaccination Requirements for Travel to Remote Communities

Effective October 30, 2021, all travellers 12 years of age and older who reside in one of the designated remote communities and are travelling on any Air Borealis flight to a remote community via a designated gateway airport may be required to produce one of the following:

- Proof of full vaccination (including valid paper documents, NLVaxPass or Government issued QR code) with the last dose having been received on or before October 16th, 2021.
- Proof of negative PCR test taken within 72 hours prior to scheduled departure time, along with a government issued photo ID or two pieces of non-government issued ID; or
- Proof of positive COVID-19 PCR test taken 14 to 180 days before the scheduled departure

Residents from remote communities who cannot provide a valid proof of vaccination will be required to take a self-administered instant COVID-19 test prior to their departing flight from a gateway airport; proof of vaccination is not required when leaving a remote community. We kindly ask any passenger eligible to take an instant COVID-19 test to arrive 90 minutes prior their scheduled departure time to deliver the completed test results.

It is important that all travellers confirm the name on their government issued photo ID or two pieces of non-government issued ID, as well as the name listed on the proof of vaccination/ QR code correctly match the name on the reservation. Travellers younger than 12 years of age travelling on a Air Borealis flight will take on the vaccination status of the parent or guardian travelling with them.

Travellers who provide false or misleading information may be subject to a fine of up to \$5,000.

Effective November 30, 2021, all travellers 12 years of age and older who reside in one of the designated remote communities and are travelling on any Air Borealis flight to a remote community via a designated gateway airport may be required to produce one of the following:

- Proof of full vaccination
- Proof of a medical or religious exemption with an approved negative PCR test

The Government of Canada is currently reviewing requirements for travel to remote communities. As information around these new requirements becomes available, we will update our travel policies as soon as possible.
