



## How do I qualify as a fully vaccinated traveler in Canada?

There are still restrictions for travel within Canada. **Starting October 30, 2021**, all travellers 12 years of age and older flying on commercial passenger aircraft will need to be fully vaccinated to board domestic or international flights departing Canadian airports.

To qualify as a fully vaccinated traveller within Canada, you must:

- have received at least two doses of a Government of Canada-accepted COVID-19 vaccine or a mix of two accepted vaccines
  - or at least 1 dose of the Janssen/Johnson & Johnson vaccine

- have received your second dose at least 14 full days prior to the day you travel
  - Example: if your second dose was anytime on Thursday July 1, then Friday July 16 would be the first day that you meet the 14-day condition;
- have no signs or symptoms of COVID-19;
- bring official proof of vaccination with you for your trip
